

From the Outside of the Window

The ordination of Dcn Dang to priesthood next Saturday 22nd of September, here at St. James, gives me a welcome opportunity to personally reflect about the priesthood. When I was ordained a priest thirteen years ago, the ecclesial world was more or less still “ok”. I was a young man in his late twenties who had just been appointed professor, secretary general and director of finance. Even though I had daily a workload of 13 hours, I was filled with joy and was very enthused about the priesthood.

Little have I heard then of the unspeakable sexual abuse by clergy, although it was already looming in Ireland and in the U.S. It has shattered and bruised the perception of priests – and rightly so. For too long, some priests, bishops and cardinals believed themselves to be “untouchable”. As Augustine has said in his *Sermon 46*, this type of shepherd was more interested in feeding himself with praise, honour and power. Self-indulgent and self-absorbed clergy will never go far. Through their scandalous way of living, they have killed even the strong sheep. Augustine writes: “How do they kill them? By leading bad lives, by setting a bad example.” Then Augustine spoke about his very personal concern and about his greatest fear as a pastor of souls: “What I am really afraid of is that if I neglect you, I may kill what is strong.”

For my ordination, I chose the biblical verse from 1 *Corinthians 4:7* “For who sees anything different in you? What do you have that you did not receive? If then you received it, why do you boast as if you did not receive it?” I read this verse everyday as a reminder of my own weakness and the grace of God that I have received. The priesthood is what we called an “unmerited gift” from God. Not my personal talents or skills, but the faith and trust in God matters. With Jeremiah and St. Paul, I have to say to myself: “Let not a wise man boast of his wisdom, and let not the mighty man boast of his might, let not a rich man boast of his riches ... LET HIM WHO BOASTS, BOAST IN THE LORD.” The greatest wisdom is the obedience to God.

Of course, a priestly life is not just happiness. There are dark days as well, days of temptations and failure, hours of falling into sins, moments of resignation and despair. All these, however, cannot take away the loving kindness of God. The joy of a priest is rooted in Christ’s invitation to **share in the ministry of healing and deliverance**. And, it is a great privilege indeed. For me, it is the reason why I am happy and blessed to serve as a priest. As such, I must go back to the original dream. Like the apostles, I must return to Galilee when the dream was born. Along the way, I have become wounded and hurt in the ministry. I have become disillusioned and sometimes secularized by the world, like those in the world. I have forgotten my dream. I have lost the vision and the original reason for being a priest. So it is opportune that I recover the lost vision of wanting to bring the peace, love and forgiveness of Christ to a suffering and hopeless humanity.

Consequently, **I cannot but be grateful for the mercy and love of our Lord**. To be chosen by the Lord to be His minister of the Eucharist and be given the power and the authority at the ordination to make the paschal mystery present is indeed such a great gift. At the ordination, I have vowed also that I would not want to waste this great grace I have received on behalf of the People of God. Otherwise, I would have received it in vain. Since I have been given more, more will be expected of me to grow in holiness and to give my life completely for the service of Christ and His Church.

With this personal reflection, I congratulate Dcn Dang on his new priestly journey. I would like also to remind him of the great mercy and love of our Lord. To live as a priest is not to live for the praise, honour or power; but to be nourished by the Lord who “humbled himself and became a servant”. Be a good and faithful witness like Jesus, who is “the faithful witness, the First-born from the dead, the Ruler of the kings of the earth.”

Let us all pray for Dcn Dang and for each other.
