## **Welcoming An Outsider**

We in the parish office decided last week that I was going to compose my first article for the Parish Bulletin for this weekend. Honestly, a part of me felt a bit anxious. I should confess, I have never written an article for the weekend Bulletin in the previous parish I was assigned to. So writing this and having this published to be read by our parishioners, I feel like delivering my first ever homily. However, it is unlike a homily which is based on a particular Sunday's readings, because in writing this first one, I have no readings to ground my reflection on. Nevertheless, another part of me feels that I should make the most of the

opportunity that is presented. And the opportunity is to be able to address everyone in the parish community. Such a privilege! So if it's not the Sunday reading that this first article is grounded on, what then am I basing it on? I am basing this maiden article on the reality that we, the Augustinians who minister to the parishioners here, come and go. The fact is, the Parish existed already even before the Augustinians came to minister here. You, on the other hand, the parishioners, as a collective, have been the continuous presence in the community. And so, the way it looks to me, you are the hosts, and I am your guest.

Indeed, as one of the newest guests in the parish, I might start by briefly introducing myself to all. My name is Francis Belciña, OSA, and I am the newly appointed Parish Priest here at St James Parish, Coorparoo; and I am also a new member of the Villanova Augustinian Community. My first encounter with the Augustinians was way back in Kindergarten when I went to an



Augustinian school in Cebu City, Philippines. But, of course, I was not always an Augustinian and a priest, I was first of all a son of Arturo and Rosita Belciña; a middle child, the second of four boys.



I came to this part of the world to start my formation with the Augustinians in the Province of Australasia in 2010. I made my solemn profession (permanent vows) to the Order of St Augustine on 22 May 2016. From July 2016 till January 2019, I was a member of the Manly Vale Augustinian Community, in Manly Vale, Sydney. I was ordained a deacon together with Fr Saldie on 15 October 2016. And on 27 May 2017, together with Fr Saldie and Fr Percival, I was ordained a priest in Sydney. My appointment in North Harbour Parish (Manly Vale and Balgowlah) was as Youth Minister and Associate Pastor.

I have started to slowly make my way through the parish after arriving in Brisbane on the 1<sup>st</sup> February 2019 for this new appointment. With Fr Dang helping me in this role, I have felt your

warm hospitality and welcome. Thank you for welcoming me, an outsider.


