View From The Pews

(from the Chair of the Parish Pastoral Council)

It is over fifty years since I first came to St James Parish. Things were so different then. The Second Vatican Council had been in session from 1962 to 1965 and was regarded as the most significant religious event since the 16th century Reformation. The documents and decrees passed by the Council have helped shape the Church as it moved to read the signs of the times.

There were six Augustinians living in the Priory serving this wonderful community of Coorparoo. Up the road at Villanova there were another twelve Friars caring for the education of boys from the area. There was a community of Good Samaritan Sisters, who lived in the local convent now occupied by Centacare, caring for the Primary students of St James. Also, Lay people were in abundance and there were six Masses each Sunday to cater for these numbers, but there was minimum active involvement in the Mission of the Church, we were there to "save our souls ".

Today, there are fewer Catholics in Australia and fewer filling the pews each Sunday. Catholic churchgoers today are more highly educated and more likely to have been born overseas. As Archbishop Coleridge recently observed in The Catholic Leader, "Catholics in Australia are more than twice as likely to have a university degree than twenty years ago."

As this community of St James prepares to call on new lay leadership in the weeks ahead, I would like to put forward the needs of the various ministries working in the parish. The Parish Pastoral Council, The Finance Committee, The Liturgy Committee, St Vincent de Paul, Youth and Young Adult Ministry and Social Justice Forum all need to be strengthened by new members who are willing to become involved. It is time for each one of us to ask how we can be of service to the Risen Lord and his people.

The great commission given by Jesus was for all to "Go, teach, baptize and make disciples." We are challenged to be Missionary disciples who wish to share their loving relationship with Jesus, with others who may not necessarily have entered our church doors.

We will be calling for recommendations and suggestions for new volunteers over the coming weeks. Please give prayerful consideration to your own role in this servant leadership of the laity.

The message of Easter is still in our minds and hearts. We know what Christ has done for us out of Love. What can we, under the guidance of the Holy Spirit, do for Him and our sisters and brothers in the Lord?
