My dear friends, I share this reflection with you today to answer a question often asked of me... Who and what are the **Friends of St Augustine** in the parish of **St James**?

As the Leader of FOSA in Coorparoo, it would be a pleasure to tell you more about the life and spirituality of St Augustine. "United in mind and heart on the way to God."

(Quoted from Christians in the World by T.J. Van Bavel OSA)


A superficial reading of the Confessions can give the impression that Augustine was an introvert, forever busy with self-analysis. The reality is very different. One is surprised to learn that this man was scarcely ever alone. He was surrounded by other people. It is impossible to imagine Augustine without friends, without friendship. His speech was learned from the chatter of nurses, his jesting stimulated by laughing faces, and his vitality borrowed from his playmates. A friendship might cost him half his soul, and it was only through friendship that his wounds could be healed. He himself admitted that he could not possibly be happy without friends.

For him, friendship was always the deepest emotion of his being, In this, the passage of time left Augustine unchanged. He was seldom alone with his own thoughts. He was always talking, discussing things with his friends. Of all his works, there is none that does not constitute either a direct or indirect answer to questions addressed to him by someone else, whether we deal with a conversation, a sermon, a letter, a pamphlet, or what we would call today a book. This is probably due to the congenital solidarity of Africans, and the reason why Augustine's work is so filled with reflections on companionship and friendship.

He begins with the assumption that man is a social being. 'Every single person is a part of the whole humanity and gregarious by nature...For this reason God decided to

create all mankind from a single man; he not only desired the projected community to be united by the equality of human nature but also by family relationship.' This social mode of existence culminates in love, without which the world would be nothing but a desert.
