From the Outside of the Window

This weekend we celebrate the feast of Christ's Ascension. Comparing this feast with the resurrection, the ascension is mentioned only briefly in the New Testament. Important, however, is the fact that the Ascension always comes with the so-called Great Commission of preaching the Word of God to all nations for the sake of salvation. For Mark, it was essential to emphasise the intrinsic unity between faith, baptism and salvation. Regarding faith and salvation, he agrees with John who stated, "Whoever believes in him is not condemned, but whoever does not believe stands condemned already because he has not believed in the name of God's one and only Son." (John 3:18) Concerning baptism, we should be careful to not go beyond what is written here.

The text here only deals with the situation in which one believes and is baptised, and when one disbelieves. It says nothing about the case when one believes but has yet to get baptised. For that case we must refer to other scripture like John 3:18 above which states that upon belief one is not condemned, making no reference to baptism. Nonetheless, I would say that water baptism simply accompanies faith in Christ as naturally as repentance does, but I would dissuade those who have a "get wet to get saved" ritualistic mentality. In being taken up to heaven, Mark mentions that Jesus sat on the right hand of God. The writer of Hebrews mentions, *The* Son is the radiance of God's glory and the exact representation of his being, sustaining all things by his powerful word. After he had provided purification for sins, he sat down at the right hand of the Majesty in heaven." (Heb 1:3) Sitting indicates finished work. It's like after you get home from work, the first thing you want to do is sit down. The right hand is a hand of power. Jesus was God's right hand man. The Ascension concludes therefore what God has done in the book of Genesis where God completed his creation with the words, "And He saw that it was good. And, God rests on the seventh day." On the effect of the Ascension, let us hear from St. Augustine: "Today our Lord Jesus Christ ascended into heaven; let our hearts ascend with him. Listen to the words of the Apostle: If you have risen with Christ, set your hearts on the things that are above where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God; seek the things that are above, not the things that are on earth. For just as he remained with us even after his ascension, so we too are already in heaven with him, even though what is promised us has not yet been fulfilled in our bodies."

As always, let us pray for each other.


