Augustinian Laity's Journey Taken Further in Rome (Sylvia Phillips)

The IV International Congress of Lay Augustinians took place in Sacrofano, Rome from the 19<sup>th</sup> to the 25<sup>th</sup> June 2019. Augustinian delegates (around 100, clergy and laity), gathered from South and Central America, USA, UK, Holland, Spain, Malta and Australia. Familiar faces from attending

previous International Congresses shared the pleasure of rekindling the flame of friendship and spent time over the few days updating each other with the latest news. It was very much a time of making new friends who had the strong binding feature of travelling with Augustine. The group works which followed each presentation deepened our friendships as we listened to each others' viewpoints.

Our first speaker, Mrs. Paola Bignardi, who lives in Rome, had a strong message of where laity had come from and where we could take it. I would like to give her thoughts primary consideration. It was time for Lay people, in their activities, to be aware of the use of the tongue. It seems that the clock for laity has stopped. Laity, in their Christian mission, needs to move the hands of the clock in order to restart it. The clock while working is a useful object. It needs to be energized at regular intervals. Laity needs to "run the walk". In the past, there was a great exodus of women as they felt quite marginalized. Those who remained did so for the Love of the Church; they are the invisible presence of the Church. The importance is not only to put the hands back on the clock, it also must be regulated.

Laity, young and not so young, must take risks; dirty their hands and have a

vision for the future. Most of them have had a taste of life. Their life experiences are real and they are interactive with the Gospel and for the love of the Gospel. Take the steps to dare, to invent, to converse and to participate with open hearts of belonging.

Following Mrs. Bignardi, Fr. Andres Nino, OSA had a message of his own. Very briefly, he stressed the need to love in an orderly manner. Human beings cannot but love, in which God is the centre of gravity. We must learn how to centre our love in Christ where God is the wisdom. Learn to live in pilgrimage to God. There is a presence of the past (the past will always be with us), and presence of the future.

The other speakers: Fr. Josef Sciberras, OSA; Mr. Bill O'Connor, FAS (Villanova USA) and the Prior General of the Order Fr. Alejandro Moral Anton, OSA, while presenting their own messages, were united in encouraging the empowerment of the Laity in consultation with the Order in their local regions.

I have given you just a taste of what transpired at two of the presentations. Hopefully, our appetites are sufficiently whetted to encourage us to research these issues further, so eloquently expressed by Mrs. Bignardi "deep into chasms still untouched".


