

a pact that when conflicts concerning the welfare of the children come up, you will discuss them before making any final decisions. For example, if a child comes to you with a request after she has already asked her other parent, simply respond: "We (your parents) will talk about (the request), later and we'll get back to you with our decision." Whether children know it or not, they need to have parents who back each other up.

I learned from my own parents to always show respect for my husband. In all of my growing up years, I never heard my dad or mom speak one word against the other. And my siblings and I certainly were not allowed to speak disrespectfully to or about them.

We were never allowed to call my mother, she, or my dad, he. My dad (who was from Poland), told us that every language

except English had a distinct pronoun to use when speaking to people we were to respect. So Mom was always Mom and Dad was Dad. It was a habit my sisters and I formed when we were young and keep to this day. It was something my husband and I tried to teach our own children.

# **This Sunday's Readings** First Reading Acts 1: 1-11 Why are you standing here looking into the sky? Jesus has been taken into heaven.

In my earlier work, Theophilus, I dealt with everything Jesus had done and taught from the beginning until the day he gave his instructions to the apostles he had chosen through the Holy Spirit, and was taken up to heaven. He had shown himself alive to them after his Passion by many demonstrations: for forty days he had continued to appear to them and tell them about the kingdom of God. When he had been at table with them, he had told them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait there for what the Father had promised. 'It is' he had said 'what you have heard me speak about: John baptised with water but you, not many days from now, will be baptised with the Holy Spirit.'

Now having met together, they asked him, 'Lord, has the time come? Are you going to restore the kingdom to Israel?' He replied, 'It is not for you to know times or dates that the Father has decided by his own authority, but you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you, and then you will be my witnesses not only in Jerusalem but throughout Judaea and Samaria, and indeed to the ends of the earth.'

As he said this he was lifted up while they looked on, and a cloud took him from their sight. They were still staring into the sky when suddenly two men in white were standing near them and they said, 'Why are you men from Galilee standing here looking into the sky? Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven, this same Jesus will come back in the same way as you have seen him go there.'

# Second Reading Ephesians 1: 17-23 He made Jesus to sit at his right hand in heaven.



'You see how it is written that the Christ would suffer and on the third day rise from the dead, and that, in his name, repentance for the forgiveness of sins would be preached to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses to this.

'And now I am sending down to you what the Father has promised.

Stay in the city then, until you are clothed with the power from on high.' Then he took them out as far as the outskirts of Bethany, and lifting up his hands he blessed them. Now as he blessed them, he withdrew from them and was carried up to heaven. They worshipped him and then went back to Jerusalem full of joy; and they were continually in the Temple praising God.
