### From the Outside of the Window

"Get real" - When someone tells you to get real, they want you to get a reality check and to stop behaving as though you're living in a fantasy world. It could apply to pretty much anyone or anything that is not living in reality. While we could all settle on this, we still need to ask the question about reality. What is to be considered a reality? There is much debate about it. Jim's view of reality may differ from John's grasp of reality. Perhaps, we can agree on this common point: To get real, one must be fully in this world and be in touch with the lives of the people. If we move from there, then we need to acknowledge that none is as real as Jesus. Being a King, he chose the real life of a villager. Instead of being served, he served all who did not know how to make ends meet. Instead of seeking his own glory, he accepted to be mocked for the sake of others. Instead of sleeping in a palace, he preferred to be "homeless" and be born in a manger surrounded by various animals. Jesus Christ promised to us that he will never depart from us, but remain with us until the end of times. This is the very reason why we celebrate the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ on this Sunday. In the history of religion, there has never been a supreme being who was ever as real as Jesus Christ.

The Church needs also to *get real*! Recent disclosures of misconducts and crimes that bishops, priests, members of religious congregations and Church employees have committed against the vulnerable, demand that we do our utmost to root out the evil. We must get real and get in touch with the real sufferings of the people. We need a financial scheme that compensates adequately those who have suffered for years. We need to get real. If proven guilty, we ask those in authority to take the necessary steps for the sake of God's people. We need to get real by telling the truth. We don't want to read any longer about the Church's concealment of abuses. We want a transparent Church that advocates the truth of life and does not hide it.

I can understand why people outside of the Church are angry. I am angry myself! I guess that there are also many faithful who are angry as well. I pray that the Church gets real and in touch with the life of the people. I pray that the Holy Spirit gives us courage to do what is necessary and truly repent.

A little step for me, as your administrator, to understand your real needs will be the Parish <u>AGM</u> (Annual General Meeting) scheduled for <u>Sunday 24<sup>th</sup></u>, <u>June after the 9am Mass</u>. As you are the <u>owners</u> of the Parish (and not the priests who come and go), the purpose of the AGM is for our owners to • ask questions about the financial statements • discuss and propose new Parish initiatives, such as the new evangelisation or social justice • talk about any governance issues or other business arising.

I would love to see you at this gathering since you are stewards of our Parish. There will be a BBQ and kids' entertainment as well. For catering purposes, could you please indicate kindly your *AGM* attendance on the sheet provided at both entrances of the church...


