Reflections from Plenary Council 2021

Due to COVID-19, the first Plenary Council assembly has been

moved to October 2021, and will now be conducted in a multi-modal format across Australia, combining online and face-to-face aspects, with the second assembly being held July 2022 in Sydney.

'Listen to What the Spirit is Saying' is the theme of the Fifth Plenary Council of Australia. 'Continuing the journey of Discernment toward the Plenary Council' initiated the process of discerning what will be the main areas discussed at the Council assembly. The working paper (*Instrumentum Laboris*) called 'Continuing the Journey' evolved from the consultation phase of the process and will be a significant part of further discernment during the assembly of members during October 2021.



"Fan the Flame" is a prayer and reflection resource package that could be used in a number of settings in parishes, schools, universities, hospitals and aged care facilities to name a few. The material is designed in such a way that it can be adjusted to suit your environment. It's been a little time since I have communicated updates in the parish. I have a **Parish Priest** few to share, in this format anyway: (1) Firstly, for quite some time now, especially during 2020 (amidst Covid-19) and until the present time, the Parish Pastoral Council (PPC) has been meeting—this was an interim group. That time period was needed, and has given myself and others some needed space, to discern what the PPCouncil's role is in the life of our Parish. Prayer and discernment as well, were spent during that period, to dialogue with a few parishioners who have wonderfully said "yes" to offer their gifts and be part of our new PPC. Just so you know, this new group will be meeting for the first time this Monday evening (7 June, 7.30pm). We are hoping that soon we will have the chance to present ourselves to the community as your new PPC. PLEASE PRAY that with hearts aflamed we may journey together well, for the good of the Church, through serving the parish in this way. (2) Secondly, the Parish Finance Council (PFC) is also mostly composed of new members who have been meeting formally since November 2020. Please be advised that there will be a Sunday coming, when one or two members of the PFC will address the parish during the Masses. (3) Our pilot season of ALPHA will conclude this coming Wednesday. Yes, we are only in the beginning stages of our ongoing "intentional" steps towards transforming our community and culture, so we are more "invitational", more "outward looking", & more "trusting in the gifts of the Holy Spirit". Be part of building this culture in our Parish! A new season of ALPHA begins in August 2021 (to be launched on 31st July). In a few weeks time, you will certainly be hearing more of this. (4) Finally, on Wednesday, 2nd June, the Parish underwent a Safeguarding Audit conducted by representatives from the Archdiocese. We at St James continue our commitment to working and maintaining our Parish as a safe place for children and vulnerable adults.

The Greatest Sacrament

Like all good Jews, Jesus and the apostles prepare for the Passover. The apostles secure a place for them to eat and celebrate the ancient ceremony of their faith. During the meal, at one of the ritual blessings, Jesus offers himself as a blessing—a blessing we continue to celebrate every day.

I have a great love for symmetry, and so I enjoy looking at trees and knowing that the branches that stretch to the sky have roots digging deep into the earth. In most healthy trees, the roots mirror the branches digging down, as far out and wide as the branches above them. People are very similar. If we hope to be healthy and whole, we need to be equally balanced, firmly rooted in the concrete reality of our lives while reaching out in the uncertainty of faith for all that is and can be.

We reach out, stretching for God, offering praise and seeking answers, but if we aren't firmly rooted in the ordinary things of our life, we're going to fall over. At the same time, we will be pretty

The Blessed Sacrament is God's supreme gift. I become one with the Body of Christ in the very concrete signs of the faithful assembled, the Word broken open, the priest and, most especially. The blessed bread and wine; I share in Jesus' divinity just as he shared in my humanity. Jesus, you see, was the first and greatest sacrament—a concrete sign that God's life was with us and in us.

In a sense, everything visible is a kind of sacrament. Even the trees I so love are signs of God's love inviting us to love God in return.
