From the Outside of the Window

On this Sunday twenty two children will receive for the first time the *Sacrament of the Holy Communion*. "*Communio*" is a Latin word and means literally "sharing" which Paul used in describing the taking of bread and wine as the body and blood of Christ. Also, from "*communio*" derives the English word "*common*", meaning participation by all. It's supposed to bring everyone together as one body. When speaking of sharing bread as the body of Christ, Paul wrote in his first letter to the Corinthians: "Because there is one bread, we who are many are one body, for we all partake of the one bread."

What remains absolutely central to the Eucharist, however, is the concept of community, the idea of overcoming distinctions and barriers, the coming together as one body to share in the one bread. Jesus came with a clear understanding of human solidarity, which he symbolized again and again in the face of fierce criticism, by breaking bread with tax collectors and sinners and outcasts, by breaking bread with the multitudes.

Communion is not just a matter of gathering in unity. It should also nourish us for an outpouring of love in the world. Jesus always did both. He gathered people to break bread together, and then he sent them out to feed and clothe and comfort others: "I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, I was naked and you gave me clothing, I was sick and you took care of me, I was in prison and you visited me... Just as you did it to the least of these [my brothers and sisters]...you did it to me."

How wonderful it would be if we make this sharing of gifts a reality for our local communities. In doing so, we might make a difference to our world. May I extend our invitation to our children of First Holy Communion and their parents to share their gifts and talents with our community of St. James? If you are a gifted musician or have a good voice, you may want to contribute to our Sunday liturgy. If you have a financial background, or work in the IT business, St. James would be very blessed if you could assist. Or, your children may serve at our altar? I am sure whichever gift you share, St. James would be grateful and cherish it.

During the last four weeks or so, Carole Danby and Ann O'Brien have helped our children with the preparation of their First Holy Communion. Their enthusiasm and faith-filled presence have made a difference to our Parish life. I would like to thank Carole and Ann for their generous contributions.

Likewise, I thank the parents of our children for their patience and commitment. I know that it is not always easy to take time out of your busy life schedule. However, I think that your children are worthy of your efforts. So, many thanks for this, and congratulations.

Last but not least, I congratulate our children for having "survived" the preparation. I hope that you have enjoyed the sessions though. I hope that you continue your journey with Jesus Christ and with our Parish of St. James. I assure you of my prayers. St. James will also pray for you. May Christ also be with you always.

Trish, our secretary, deserves also to be mentioned here. Thank you for all that you do for our children. Special thanks also go to Fr. Saldie for his pastoral care and his time to assist our children in the preparation of first reconciliation.

I hope that you all enjoy the celebration and I welcome once again our children, parents, relatives and friends of our First Holy Communion recipients to the Table of the Lord at St. James Parish.
