From the Outside of the Window

"I AM the Bread of Life". We have heard Jesus say this line for the last three Sundays (including today, and two more Sundays to come) because we are still reading and contemplating the words of Jesus from the 6th Chapter of St John's Gospel. We also hear Jesus add that he is "the living bread". Both of these statements help us understand better the gift that Jesus gives us in the Eucharist. We celebrate this gift of Jesus each time we gather for Mass here at St James' Parish. We believe that receiving Jesus in the Eucharist will lead us to eternal life. Eternal life! Yes, and the Second Vatican Council reminded us that to make a "full, conscious and active participation" of the liturgical celebration where Jesus is with us and amongst us, is one of the ways to enjoy the fullness of God's grace. That's not a hard ask, right, especially when eternal life is up for grabs?

Dear friends, our faith in Jesus is not our own doing, it has been given to us as a gift. Our faith in Jesus leads us to understand what we believe and help us live what we hoped for, a life eternal with God. Faith in God is not an easy conversation to start with especially with family and with some other friends. It is a challenge. How much harder to talk when there are real life issues like personal sufferings, social injustices, dire poverty, inhumane laws of abortion and euthanasia and homelessness and addiction in society? Let us together endure these challenges of our faith today and keep our eyes on Jesus' promise. Let us take heed of St Paul's encouragement to the Ephesians: to be imitators of Christ, who walked our earthly existence and experiences, in order for us to see what heavenly life would be. We live with faith in Jesus' healing presence. To hear this teaching and respond to it in faith is to "have" (beginning here and now) "eternal life". Hence the rightness of Jesus' claim to be "the Bread of Life" comes down from heaven to heal us and to sustain us in our daily living.

Today's Gospel also begins with a report that the Jews complained about Jesus' claims regarding his identity. They knew his family, and they knew he was the son of Joseph. They could not comprehend what Jesus meant when he said that he came down from heaven. Jesus responds to the complaints by saying that only those who are chosen by God will recognize him as the one that God sent. This is a recurring theme in John's Gospel, that God has chosen those who will have faith in Jesus. Let us enjoy God's grace as He chose us to be His own and that makes us ALL portions of the bread of life for the world we live in.

We just celebrated the feast of St Mary of the Cross MacKillop last Wednesday (August 8), our first Australian canonised Saint. She remains a reminder for all of us to keep our faith in Jesus in our earthly journeys; to be Christ for others despite all odds. Her famous quote that I keep in my heart is "Never see a need without doing something". When this is done in the name of Christ, nothing is impossible.

EKKA 2018 has just begun. Let us continue to enjoy the blessings of multiculturalism and the produce of the land. These are the blessings we all appreciate here in Queensland, despite the challenging drought that threatens our farm workers. Pray for the rain! But stay away from that flu when you're with the crowd! Have a blessed weekend to all. God bless us.


