

Mary Visits Elizabeth

Mary is pregnant when she sets off to visit her cousin Elizabeth, who is also pregnant. Mary has just said "yes" to becoming the mother of Jesus. Elizabeth welcomes Mary, and experiences a special blessing for herself and her child. She praises Mary for her faith and rejoices with her over her miracle.



Sometimes people think that Mary went to visit her relative Elizabeth to help her out during her pregnancy. Elizabeth had never had children, and everyone, including her, thought she was too old to get pregnant. But the

angel Gabriel told Mary about the miracle and reminded her that "nothing is impossible with God." So after Mary found out that she was pregnant with Jesus, she set off in hurry to see Elizabeth, who was already six months pregnant with John the Baptist. Maybe Mary went to help her, but I think it's more likely that she went to visit her older relative because she was excited, probably a little bit scared, and needed advice after she said 'yes' to bearing God's son. After all, she was just a teenager and not even married yet. She wanted someone to talk to who knew what it was like to be pregnant and could share the experience with her. How could she keep all that to herself?

As soon as they met, the babies in their wombs recognized each other, and both mothers were filled with joy and excitement about the amazing thing God was doing in them and through them. Elizabeth recognized how blessed Mary was and spoke the lines that later became a part of the Hail Mary: "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb."

Pray a decade of the rosary while remembering when you were expecting your children. Let yourself feel the amazement of what a mother's body can do in cooperation with God, and

Justice Challenge

We celebrate the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

Mary is considered the first disciple of Jesus. Her life tells us who she was: a mother,

wife, daughter, niece, friend, neighbor

and disciple. Her presence in Jesus' life has to have been formative. The scriptures reveal that Mary lived a life of generosity, compassion, forgiveness, hope and kindness. She was the very first servant leader in the church. She gave up her own status in the community for the sake of Jesus – bearing him, raising him, teaching him, and learning from him. She teaches us how to serve and how to lead.


