

Dear Parishioners of St James.

From a certain vantage point, I see Fr Dang's leaving from two perspectives: one from 'parish', and secondly from 'Augustinians'. He left St James parishioners who have known and loved him for the last 3 years. And he also chose to leave the Augustinians whom he had been with for the last 11 years. In fact, one could say, the former is a consequence brought about by the latter.

With Fr Dang's farewell from the Parish last weekend, his absence has left the parish community saddened, but hopeful for him too. Please keep him and the desires of his heart in your prayers.

This circumstance has left some gaps that the Augustinian parish team, composed of myself and Deacon Tuan, will tackle from here on. In terms of Sunday masses, as announced during the previous weekend, Fr Saldie from Villanova Priory will be helping out at one or two masses. The visitation to the sick and the homebound, which had been exclusively delegated to Fr Dang (in coordination with Karleen O'Reilly, when I began with my role as Parish Priest in early 2019} will be re-configured. With this. and the duties and roles that Dcn Tuan and I have in the Parish, Villa Priory and Province, a more thought-out reconfiguring and discernment needs to take place. One which acknowledges and honestly faces the reality of our limited resources (in personnel, time, and energy) now and in the foreseeable future.

How and with whom shall I SHARE the peace of God in Christ Jesus today?


