

God's ways are not always the accepted way of the culture in which we live. Probably our most difficult job as Catholic parents is to instil in our children a value system based on the Gospels rather than the society that surrounds them.

Our children are bombarded constantly with the values of a secular society that prizes possessions and position over just about everything else. The commercial world of social media, magazines, and Amazon teaches them to want more and more, while the competitive worlds of academics and athletic teach them the importance of being number one. We adults can get

trapped on this treadmill ourselves wanting a bigger and better car or home, the newest technological gadgets, or pushing ourselves to be the top salesperson or youngest VP in the company.

Jesus tells us to think as God thinks and to see things from God's perspective, not our own. God sees things outside of time. He sees that the treadmill of wanting more and more only gets us to the nowhere of never having enough. God sees globally: for every winner there are thousands of losers, for every rich person there are millions of poor.

We have to help our children trust in God's promise to provide all that they need. We have to help them see that God has a vested interest in each of them becoming their own personal best, not "better than" anyone else. This is definitely one of those lessons our children need to see us witness. It can't become just another sermon. We lose all credibility if we preach it without living it ourselves.

News from the Augustinian Province, Australia

Three Augustinians from the Vicariate of Our Lady of Grace, India have been invited to come and minister here in Australia. Two of them have already arrived in Sydney, namely, Fr Joseph Anson KALATHIPARAMBIL ANTONY OSA (arrived 7th August), and Fr Marydas ARACKAL FRANCIS OSA (arrived 30th August). Both are currently undertaking their initial induction requirements in Sydney, residing at Manly Vale.

Fr Joseph Anson KALATHIPARAMBIL ANTONY OSA ("Fr Anson" or

"Anson" for short), will move to Brisbane sometime in late September to commence his formal appointment to the Community at Villanova Priory, Coorparoo and as Associate Pastor at St James' Parish, Coorparoo, formally commencing on Sunday, 1st October, 2023.

Fr Anson was born in Pallaruthy, Kochi, Kerala, India on 31st March, 1982. He professed his first vows on 3rd July, 2004 and ordained to the priesthood on 8th May, 2009.

- 2009—Administrator of the St. Joseph's Church, Wayanad
- 2010-2014—Counselor and Secretory of the Delegation of Our Lady of Grace of India
- 2010-2014—Assistant Parish Priest of the Mary Queen Help of Christian Church, Aluva
- 2014-2018—Delegation Treasurer, Councilor and Administrator of the school in Pollachi
- 2017-2022—Vicariate Councilor, Treasurer of the vicariate, Director and Administrator of the school in Pollachi.

This Sunday's Readings

22nd Sunday Ordinary Time (Year A/1)

First Reading Jeremiah 20: 7-9 The word of the Lord God has meant derision for me.

You have seduced me, Lord, and I have let myself be seduced; you have overpowered me: you were the stronger. I am a daily laughing stock, everybody's butt.

Each time I speak the word, I have to howl and proclaim: 'Violence and ruin!'

The word of the Lord has meant for me insult, derision, all day long.

I used to say, 'I will not think about him, I will not speak in his name any more.'

Then there seemed to be a fire burning in my heart, imprisoned in my bones.

The effort to restrain it wearied me, I could not bear it.

Psalm 62(63):2-6,8-9 My soul is thirsting for you, O Lord my God.

O God, you are my God, for you I long; for you my soul is

thirsting.
My body pines for you like a dry, weary land

without water.

Then Jesus said to His disciples,

"If anyone wishes to come after Me,

and take up his cross and follow Me.

Aatthew 16:24

So I gaze on you in the sanctuary

to see your strength and your glory.

For your love is better than life, my lips will speak your praise.

So I will bless you all my life, in your name I will lift up my hands.

My soul shall be filled as with a banquet,

my mouth shall praise you with joy.

For you have been my help; in the shadow of your wings I rejoice.

My soul clings to you; your right hand holds me fast.

Second Reading Romans 12: 1-2 May you present your bodies as a living sacrifice.

Think of God's mercy, my brothers, and worship him, I beg you, in a way that is worthy of thinking beings, by offering your

living bodies as a holy sacrifice, truly pleasing to God. Do not model yourselves on the behaviour of the world around you, but let your behaviour change, modelled by your new mind. This is the only way to discover the will of God and know what is good, what it is that God wants, what is the perfect thing to do.

Gospel Reading *Matthew 16: 21-27 Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself.*

Jesus began to make it clear to his disciples that he was destined to go to Jerusalem and suffer grievously at the hands of the elders and chief priests and scribes, to be put to death and to be raised up on the third day. Then, taking him aside, Peter started to remonstrate with him. 'Heaven preserve you, Lord;' he said 'this must not happen to you.' But he turned and said to Peter, 'Get behind me, Satan! You are an obstacle in my path, because the way you think is not God's way but man's.'

Then Jesus said to his disciples, 'If anyone wants to be a follower of mine, let him renounce himself and take up his cross and follow me. For anyone who wants to save his life will lose it; but anyone who loses his life for my sake will find it. What, then, will a man gain if he wins the whole world and ruins his life? Or

what has a man to offer in exchange for his life?

'For the Son of Man is going to come in the glory of his Father with his angels, and, when he does, he will reward each one according to his behaviour.'
