

Archbishop Coleridge urges action to thwart euthanasia laws

BRISBANE Archbishop Mark Coleridge has issued a letter urging Catholics, their families and friends to sign a petition to the Queensland Parliament demanding MPs reject proposed euthanasia and assisted suicide laws.

In the next few weeks parliamentarians will debate and then vote on a controversial Voluntary Assisted Dying Bill that would legalise euthanasia in the state.

"These laws, if passed, will overtum foundational principles that have underpinned our medical and legal systems for centuries - the ethic of 'do no harm' and the prohibition on killing," Archbishop Coleridge said in the letter addressed to all ''friends of Christ".

"We need to do all we can to protect Queenslanders rather than assist them in dying.


"Euthanasia and assisted suicide laws undermine the fundamental relationship of trust that should exist between a patient and their doctor.

"They have the potential to put vulnerable Queenslanders who are elderly or terminally ill at risk of wrongful death, induding placing pressure on them to take their own lives so as not to be a 'burden' on their family and friends.

"We have seen this occur in countries overseas which have gone down this path."

Archbishop Coleridge has called on Catholics to sign a petition sponsored by HOPE, a single-issue coalition of groups that oppose euthanasia and assisted suicide.



There is a great lesson in this for all of us. We need to make sure our actions back up our words. This is especially true when dealing with children. Telling youngsters God is important without witnessing how God fits into our own lives can leave children questioning our words.

Children need to hear us talk about our faith, but they also need to see us praying, reading Scripture and giving our time in service. People believed Jesus because he was so authentic. His actions

witnessed the truth of his message. Perhaps if we do the same, our love will touch the faith of another person, and we may witness some small miracles of our own.

Jesus returns to Galilee to preach. People with all sorts of ailments were brought to him. When a deaf man with a speech impediment is brought, Jesus takes him away from the crowd to heal him. As he has done before, Jesus tells the crowd not to tell anyone.


