Living Up to Your Potential

Jesus teaches through another story. A man entrusts his servants with his possessions while he is on a journey. The first servant receives five talents; he trades them and ends up with ten. Ask each person to answer the question, "What do I think God wants from me?"


PERSONAL RESPONSE

In the parable of the talents, the servant buries the treasure because he is afraid of losing it. He gives into his fear and it ends up costing him everything. Fear that is rooted in an uncertainty of our own worth can be like that. Fear of failure or rejection, or even the fear of being laughed at, can paralyse a person. Don't let that happen to you. Discover who God created you to be and be that person. Develop your gifts and How can I take more responsibility for Jesus' call when it comes time to face your creator you are bound to hear, "Well done."


