## From the Outside of the Window

Welcome to our annual Multicultural Mass this Sunday. Australia is a multicultural nation where there is a rich interaction and sharing of customs, values, faiths and languages. In 2017, Australia recorded 24,702,900 residents, with 28% of Australians born overseas. According to the recent Census, 5,500,000 Australians are Catholics (around 26% of the Australian population). One of the most striking features of the Catholic population is its ethnic diversity. Nearly a quarter of Australia's Catholics (23.6 per cent) were born overseas, and about three-quarters of those people (17.9 per cent of all Catholics) were born in non-English speaking countries. A further 124,618 Catholics are of Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander origin – that's 2.3 per cent of all Australia's Catholics. The main countries in which Australia's Catholics were born are: 1. Most Italian Catholics arrived in Australia in the 1950s and 60s, so that now almost two-thirds of them are aged 60 or more. 2. In contrast, almost 90 per cent of Catholics born in the Philippines are aged under 60, so that it is highly probable that by the time of the next Census, the Philippines will have displaced Italy as the overseas country contributing the highest number of Catholics to the Australian population. 3. Catholics born in the Sudan or South Sudan (there were 7,983 of them in 2011) have the youngest age profile, with almost 80 per cent being under the age of 40.

Associated with this ethnic diversity is the fact that Australia's Catholics speak a wide range of languages other than English at home; the most common (in diminishing order) being Italian, Filipino languages, Spanish, Arabic, Vietnamese, Croatian, Chinese languages, Polish and Maltese. Many people are surprised to find Arabic on this list- it is spoken by Catholics from Lebanon and other parts of the Middle-East and North Africa, particularly Catholics belonging to the Maronite Rite. Another interesting fact related to language, but one which has nothing to do with ethnicity or birthplace, is that the main language 'spoken' at home by 2,500 Catholics in 2011 was a sign language. Every week around Australia, Mass is celebrated in more than 30 languages.

Here at St. James, we also have noticed this transformation. While preparing the flags for the celebration, I have counted at least fifteen nations. The multiculturalism is very tangible in our Parish. The most important thing I have observed at St. James is the generous contribution made by the many groups to our Parish. In spite of many cultural backgrounds, we all speak the one language of God. Our common task is to love God and our neighbour.

I would like to thank you all for this love and for the various ways each of you enriches our Parish life with your distinguished culture. I am very grateful to our Young Adult Group for the coordination of the Multicultural celebration. Thanks a million.

I am also pleased to announce changes of Parish leadership that will take effect from 21st January 2019. In consultation with the Augustinian Provincial Council, Archbishop Mark Coleridge has appointed Fr. Francis Belcina OSA Parish Priest of St. James. Here is a short biography of Fr. Francis OSA: 1996: Punla Scholar - Graduated High School at University of San Jose-Recoletos, Basak; 1996 – 2001: Entered the Order of St. Augustine Seminary, in Quezon City; 2001: Requested a break and left the Order; 2004: Took and passed the Board Exam for Teachers (LET); 2004 – 2007: Taught at the University of Cebu-Banilad Campus; 2008 – 2009: Part-time teaching and Band Singing; 2010 – present:

Entered back to the seminary, the same congregation, the Order of St. Augustine (OSA). On 22 May, 2016, took the Solemn Vows to the Order, now affiliated to the Augustinian Province in Australia. He was ordained to the Deaconate on October 15, 2016. And last May 27, 2017, ordained to the Priesthood in Manly Vale, Sydney, Australia.

Fr. Dang OSA remains at St. James as associate pastor and Fr. Saldie OSA will return as fulltime chaplain to Villanova College. We are grateful to the Augustinians and to Archbishop Coleridge for the appointment of Fr. Francis OSA. I am sure that you will welcome him with joy. My administration will end therefore in January 2019.
