Parish

A couple of changes to our regular mass times at St James Parish:

This is probably one of the hardest decisions I have ever made as Parish Priest, and I know this won't be the last either. I have began relaying this information first with our volunteers a fortnight ago, then last Sunday with those who attended the 6pm Sunday mass. This is what I relayed to them: Beginning 20th December, we will no longer have the 6pm Sunday Mass schedule. This means that next Sunday, 13th December, will be the last Sunday that we will have a 6pm Sunday Mass. I have been asked as to whether this is only temporary, and as far as the Augustinians in Australia are concerned (considering the current number of Augustinians in active ministry and the parishes and other ministries under our care

Advent 2nd Rite of Reconciliation

Wednesday 9th DECEMBER 2020, 7.30pm St James Church—YOU ARE INVITED!

Outline of the 2nd Rite of Reconciliation

The Second Rite of Reconciliation "shows more clearly the communal nature of penance" (Sacrament of Penance #22).

The community gathers having been given some formation beforehand so that for them the celebration is more fruitful and they understand the aim of the rite.

Hymns for Reflection and Welcome

The Word of God

The Word of God is proclaimed, and in the homily, prepares those gathered in heart and mind to come to reconciliation with a deeper understanding of God's love and forgiveness.

Examination of Conscience

During the examination of conscience there should be time given for those attending to reflect on how they have fallen short of their commitment to Jesus Christ.

Personal Reconciliation

The priests stand in full view of all in a space were the penitent can be seen but not heard. While no time restriction is placed on the individual, good manners and sense dictate that people limit the time they spend with the priest.

If it is necessary to spend time in discussion then the first rite of reconciliation is where that is best suited to take place.

Conclusion

After confessions, a prayer of thanksgiving and a blessing are recited. These are not an added extra, but an integral part of the rite and should be attended by all those gathered.

Prepare Your Way

Mark begins his Gospel by telling us about John the Baptist, Jesus' cousin. He describes him as a prophet and messenger sent to prepare the people for Jesus. John is rather strange. He lives in the desert, eats and dresses oddly, yet he has attracted a large group of followers. He tells them "The one who is more powerful than I is coming after me" (v. 7).

John the Baptist tells his followers, "I have baptized you with water, but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit" (v. 8). The "he" of course is Jesus, and the distinction John makes concerning baptism is important. John's followers have repented and turned away from sin. He uses water to symbolize a cleansing from sin and a new beginning. Jesus' baptism presupposes the turning away from sin. His baptism not only marks the end of sin, but also the beginning of a new life, a life in pursuit of love and truth.

When we are baptized we receive the Holy Spirit, who not only gives us new life but also blesses us with the gift we need to enter into that life. Jesus' baptism points us in a new direction and inaugurates us into a new way of living. The gift of the Holy Spirit is an invitation to action. It is not enough to just repent from evil—we must also become actively involved in the pursuit of good. This is the baptism we received when the water that symbolizes both death and new beginning was poured over our heads.

Sometime this week take out the pictures of your child's baptism. Remind them that on that day they received Jesus' Spirit, and were

Justice Challenge

The Responsorial Song for Sunday sings of justice and peace kissing when the Messiah comes. The psalmist proclaims, "Justice shall walk before him..." So many scripture readings remind us that one of the best paths to peace comes through achieving justice—making sure everyone has what he or she needs to live a life of dignity and hope. The root of conflict can usually be found when people are denied their basic human rights. Your challenge this week is to discuss as a family or household what you think the connection is between justice and peace. Then choose one act of justice which you can do to bring more peace to our world. What is God calling you to do this week—in your immediate family, in your parish or school, in your community, or even in the world itself—to help someone secure the human rights they have been denied? Remember that we Catholics believe they deserve these rights, not by earning them or buying them or even achieving them, but because they are part of the human family, just like you and me, created in God's own image and likeness.


