From the Parish Priest

Good day to everyone!

- We are already in the month of November when we especially offer prayers to all of our faithful departed. All our November masses are offered for the souls of our beloved ones. Should you wish to include them in our prayer and mass intentions, please write their names on the 'Book of the Dead'.
- For a couple of years now at St James, we have celebrated the Christmas Novena Masses, a Filipino tradition which Fr Saldie brought to the parish when he was still assigned here. This occurs on 16-24 December with a Mass and usually followed by shared meal. As we are nearing December, I am calling on our Filipino community who wish for the "Simbang Gabi" tradition to continue here at St James to take lead in organising (liturgy: readers, servers; music; contacting food sponsors for each day: setting up and setting down, etc.; sharing mass info to other parishes). Although a Filipino tradition, these masses been welcomed everyone from all cultures. So, everyone

- is invited to take part in organising the "Simbang Gabi". I'm setting a date for an initial meeting on 15th November at St James Priory at 7:30pm. Please spread the word! Once again, everyone is welcome!
- A couple of days ago, the works at the OSHS (Outside) school hours services) Centre were concluded and children have come back after vacating the place right before the school break (this centre is the building on the corner of Rialto St and Old Cleveland Rd (to the right of the church). The works mainly consisted of the removal of interior asbestos sheeting; internal carpentry works and interior painting. Since this is parish property, the parish paid for the works totalling: \$48,413.75. Quite a hefty amount, yes, but one that is needed for the safety of everyone using the space, our children and staff. Also, I have been in conversation with the OSHS personnel concerning the strong possibility of using the space on Sundays when we resume with our Children's Liturgy. They are amenable with the proposition.
- It was wonderful last Sunday that we were able to celebrate the Multi-Culturality of our community with the Mass and fellowship. A big thank you to all who've contributed in making the liturgy and gathering in the hall a positive one. Living Life With a Generous Heart

Jesus mentions widows twice in this reading. The first time is when he strongly criticizes the scribes for walking around in fine robes while they "devour widows' houses" (v. 40) The second reference is when he points out a generous widow who puts her whole livelihood into the collection.



The widow in this Gospel was certainly a woman of faith and an example to all of us. However, I don't think Jesus is telling us that we are all expected to give away everything we have and just trust in him. This is what he told the rich man, of course, and what he seems to be praising in this story of the widow.

our lives poor in spirit, not getting too comfortable with what we have or what we earn. Financial security is no longer a given reality even for folks who work hard, have a dozen degrees and have served a company loyally for years. The widow gave up her livelihood willingly, but in today's economic world some of us are forced into that situation involuntarily. Like the widow, we need to know that no matter what happens we will be OK. We need her faith in a God who always provides.

But the call to poverty is a specific call and not one that all of us are meant to live. What I do think Jesus expects of us is to live our lives with a generous heart and with the same faith the widow had as she gave her last two coins away. There is a clear message here that we are not to live like the scribes, enjoying the high life, driving expensive cars, wearing fine clothes at the expense of other people. Jesus is also quite clear about sharing what we have with those who are in need. We are not to give just from the extra money we have, the surplus, but also from our bounty. It may not be necessary to give everything away, but we should

give away enough to at least feel the pinch.


