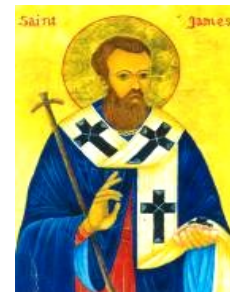

Bringing Home the Gospel

December 25, 2020 • Christmas Day • John 1:1-18

Jesus Is Born

In John's Gospel there is no account of Jesus' birth. Instead, John reminds us that Jesus has been a reality since the beginning, even before creation. Jesus is the Word who was with God and was God. Father, Son and Spirit are not sequential. They are One. The Word became flesh, he brought new life, and this life was a light shining in the darkness. "The true light, which enlightens everyone, was coming into the world" (v. 9).

On the first Christmas, a child was born who would change the world forever. He brought strength to the weak, courage to the fearful, consolation to the sad, and hope to the abandoned. The child was Jesus. He brought light into the darkness.

All through the New Testament, and especially in John's Gospel, we hear Jesus referred to as "the light." We can understand this metaphor when we contrast the gift of light to darkness. Nothing else changes when the lights go out, but in the dark we may feel disoriented and vulnerable, sometimes even afraid. Turn on the lights, and we regain our sense of place and position. This is precisely why Jesus came.

When the world was created, it was good. There was harmony in the universe and a sense of peace in that harmony. When people were created, they were created good. Scripture tells us that humans were created in the image and likeness of God. With their Creator they shared the ability to love and to create good out of love. Somewhere along the way this was forgotten, evil moved in, and the lights went out. Disorientation, vulnerability and fear followed. Love became tarnished, and what humans designed was not always good.

Then came the first Christmas, and a new light came into the world. As John tells us in his Gospel, those who accepted the light were given the power to become the children of God. They regained their sense of place and position. The darkness had no power over them. They knew who they were and whose they were. Christmas celebrates this light, this life born in Bethlehem, with us still today and yet to come in glory.

Baptisms

Baptism Preparation - Dcn Tuan-Anh is offering this baptismal preparation in our church. Come with your partner and your child. Baptisms can only occur after the baptismal preparation has been completed.



Welcoming Rite - Presentation of your child to our parish community a week or 2 before the Baptism at a mass that is convenient to your family (Saturday Vigil 6pm; Sunday 7am or 9am).

BAPTISM - after Sunday 9am mass at 10.30am (to be attended by baptismal parents; baby; godparents; family & friends according to number restrictions + hygiene procedures given by Qld Gov't and Arch Bne).

Sacramental program for children

After Baptism, your child will be Confirmed (usually around 8yrs of age). After

Confirmation, your child will receive First Holy Communion (usually around 9yrs of age). And finally, your child will have receive Penance or Reconciliation (usually around 10yrs of age).

*Sacrament of Confirmation Program completed in Term 2 (Yr 3 or older).

*First Holy Communion completed in Term 3 (Yr 4 or older).

RCIA Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults



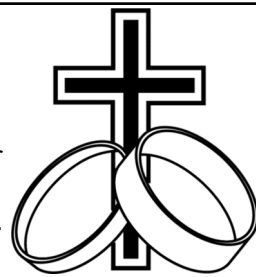
Dates – Sunday mornings from October—November 2020 + January 31st–March 28th 2021 inclusive.

Times – 9.30-10.15am. Those who then wish to be received into the Catholic faith will be baptised (if necessary), receive Confirmation and receive the Eucharist at the Easter vigil on Saturday, April 3rd, 2021.

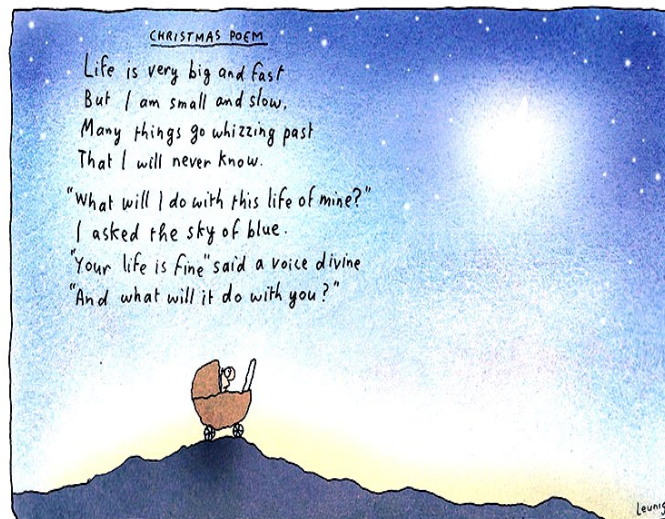
Groups currently meeting in our parish hall:

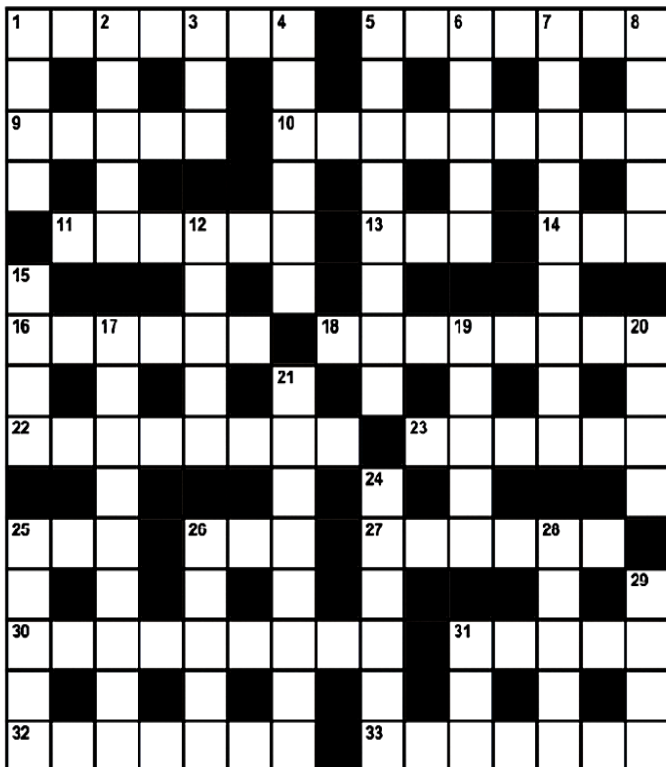

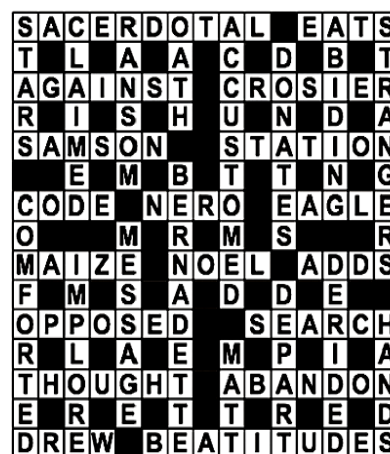

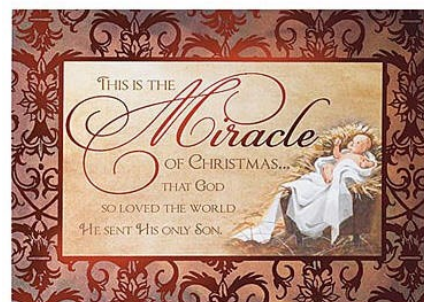
Today's Readings: Nativity of the Lord:
