

From the Outside of the Window

Good-Bye

In this Sunday's Gospel, we note Luke's attention to political and historical detail. He mentioned the names of Roman Emperor Tiberius Caesar, Pontius Pilate, the Roman Governor of Judea who sentenced Jesus to death; and lastly, the four regional rulers of Israel. They all shared one common interest. They cleaved to their thrones at the cost of the poor. Their focus was to save themselves. Luke shows that salvation preached by John is for all people and situated in world events. Yet, God's salvation is understood as God's breaking into this political and social history.

John's preaching of the coming of the Lord is a key theme of the Advent season. As John's message prepared the way for Jesus, we too are called to prepare ourselves for Jesus' coming. We respond to John's message by repentance and reform of our lives. We are also called to be prophets of Christ, who announce by our lives the coming of the Lord, as John did.

When I started my ministry here at St. James, Malcolm Turnbull was PM and Bill Shorten was Leader of the Opposition. QLD was in the hand of the Palaszczuk's government. Except the change of a new PM, the political situation has not changed much. True too, I do not see myself as a priest challenging the political class. My intention was to calm down the waves of confusion and uncertainty caused by the unexpected departure of Fr. Jaison and the coming and going of Frs. Dave Austin, Peter Jones and Pete Wieneke. True too, I was not given much time by my Provincial who had asked me to act only as a *caretaker*, until he appointed a new Parish Priest for St. James. Now, my time is up: January 20th is my last day at St. James.

In comparison to John, I am too insignificant to write about what I may have achieved at St. James. To me, it doesn't matter much. None is irreplaceable. The only one thing that truly matters is the presence of Jesus in our lives. It is Jesus Christ who at all times cares for us! He is the one who transforms and leads us. Unlike the many priests, His coming is not departure since His name is EMMANUELL (meaning "God is with us"). This fellowship should help us to realize how rich Christ is. He is the Word of God – we are rich through Christ.

My late mother, who sadly passed away in February this year, has bequeathed me with a rich sense of duty and commitment. I could see my time at St. James as a duty accomplished. Yet, my heart is heavily plagued with a sense of guilt. Have I treated all at St. James with magnanimity or with respect or dignity? Have I been honest?

Since John's preaching was about repentance and forgiveness, *I hope that you also forgive me because of my shortcomings and weaknesses, for which I really repent*.

You all have been good to me during the past nine months. These months were among the best days of my life. While I can never repay my debt to you, I wish that you know that you will be in my prayers.

As we are now in the summer season of holidays and you may be travelling, I just want to say "Good-bye" to you. May the good Lord always keep you in his love.

As always, let us pray for each other, Fr. Joe.




