# From the Outside of the Window

**Christmas** – I have an ambiguous feeling. On the one hand, I am spiritually overwhelmed by the sincerity of God's love. Through his taking on our human weaknesses in Jesus, He assures us that sins can be forgiven. Sins do not have the last word because Christ is his Father's eternal Word. This Word denounces the Fake News that was designed to manipulate us by saying that it is good to celebrate exuberant consumerism: self-indulgence is good for our sense of self-fulfilment. At this point, it is important to recall the true message of Christmas: Christmas giving goes back to a time when Christians gave one another *small* gifts in celebration and in imitation of God's great gift to us, which is the incarnation of Christ. The simplicity of that birth has given Christians ever since pause to realize that God chose to communicate the great mystery of His love and mercy by sending us the least threatening divine presence we can imagine — a small child totally dependent on his parents.

On the other hand, Christmas arouses in me a feeling of sadness. Since becoming a religious and then a priest, I haven't been able to celebrate Christmas with my family for the last two decades, as I have been serving in many places and countries. This year, it is even more confusing as I have just lost my mum. More distressing, I am unable to be home with my dad for Christmas. So, I can imagine the sense of loneliness that many – unknown to me – experience this Christmas. I can only sympathise with them. I am thinking of the refugees, orphans, widows and parents who mourn and grieve the loss of their children. My heart is also with those who are sick and those who have been forgotten. For me, the best answer to loneliness is the intimate presence of God in my life. An authentic and deeply personal relationship with our Lord enables me to be at peace, knowing that God knows me, understands me and loves me. This gift also opens the door for me to find people to whom I can share my joys and struggles. Perhaps, you may seek intimacy with the Lord too. This is the greatest gift to a lonely heart.

Now, let us also reflect on the wider picture. 2018 was a "horrible year" for the Church. The cry of those being abused by priest and nuns, and by those who are at the same time grandparents, parents, uncles and trustworthy friends resonates in our ears and shakes the foundation of our being. They have betrayed Christ and have sinned terribly! The psychological devastation of children is petrifying. So, let us ask with Pope Benedict XVI: "We must ask ourselves what was wrong in our message, in our entire way of configuring the Christian being that allowed such a thing to occur." It is not enough to apologise and recompense the victims financially. We must find a new determination in faith and moral goodness that appears in the child Jesus, who shows us again the value of the beauty of life. Christmas calls for true justice.

2018 was also a "terrible year" for the protection and dignity of life. For me, the termination of *unwanted* babies is horrifying. How is it justifiable that around 70,000 unwanted pregnancies were being aborted per year in Australia? While it is laudable to protect the lives of mothers who are at risk of health, the new legislation also gives a free ride to those who just refuse to accept responsibilities for the unborn. A culture or civilisation is great only through its compassion! Christmas calls for true mercy.

At Christmas, God bequeaths to us the gift of life. So to celebrate Christmas is to let His divine mercy be born in our hearts through the Spirit, as we become the adopted sons and daughters in Christ. Then, sharing in His paschal mystery, we give ourselves in complete selflessness and humility to the service of our fellow humans, we share in His resurrection.

Consequently, notwithstanding all the joys and rejoicing, let us not forget to let Christ be born again in our hearts in contemplative prayer and worship, just as Mary and the shepherds did. In our merry-making, we must not be so distracted and become so worldly that we do not have time to ponder over this event quietly and meaningfully. We must not fall into the temptation of allowing the external celebrations and rejoicing to crowd out the objective of our celebration – the mercy and grace of God revealed to us in Christ Jesus. May you all have a holy and blessed Christmas!

As always, let us pray for each other, Fr. Joe.
