

19 March 2020 Solemnity of St Joseph

TO THE PASTORS AND PEOPLE OF THE ARCHDIOCESE OF BRISBANE

These are anxious times as we enter new and uncharted territory. The spread of the coronavirus is alarming for a generation that has known nothing like it, and it shows how fragile we are. How long it will last we do not know, but almost certainly we are in for the long haul. For all of us, this is a challenge at many levels.

In the Archdiocese there is a daily meeting to address the most recent advice from the Government and the health authorities and to consider its implications for the Catholic community. As a result, we have already taken some decisions to curb the spread of the virus. Now in the light of the latest advice from the Government and Catholic Health Australia, the Archdiocese has come to further decisions. Therefore, the provisions below will now apply and more are sure to follow:

- The celebration of Mass on Sundays (including the Saturday vigil) is suspended with immediate effect and until further notice, and all the faithful are dispensed from the Sunday obligation.
- Priests will continue to celebrate Mass (the Mass for the people) on Sundays without a
 congregation, with people able to follow Masses live-streamed from the Cathedral at
 archbne.org/bzw on Sundays and weekdays.
- For the time being, weekday Masses may be celebrated as scheduled, with the current restrictions and precautions to be observed.
- The Sacrament of Reconciliation should in general be celebrated only by appointment with the priest, with the current precautions to be observed.
- Any Church celebration or event where more than 100 people are expected should be cancelled or postponed.
- All attending any Church celebration or event should respect the requirements of physical distancing.
- All ministers of Holy Communion, including the priest, should disinfect their hands before and after distributing.
- In the Ordinary Form of the Latin Rite, the Body of Christ should be administered only in the hand and the chalice should be received by the celebrant alone.
- The Sign of Peace should be limited to saying "Peace be with you" with a nod or bow; no hand-shaking or hand-holding should occur here or at the Our Father.
- Hymn books should not be used.
- As far as possible, churches should remain open to allow private prayer; the Blessed Sacrament might be exposed in the monstrance for this purpose (as long as fewer than 100 are attending and with the usual provisions for reverence and security of the Sacrament).

- Communion to the sick should be taken by priests alone and in general be restricted to Viaticum to the dying, with the current restrictions and precautions to be observed.
- Prayers of intercession for an end to the pandemic and for the safety of all should be included in Masses, in the Liturgy of the Hours and in private prayer; houses of consecrated religious are asked to intensify their intercessory prayer also.
- Baptisms, weddings and funerals may be celebrated, but restricted if necessary to immediate family; baptisms and weddings can always be postponed.
- Preparation for and celebration of First Penance, Confirmation and First Communion should be postponed until the pandemic is over.
- Priests should ensure that parishioners can contact them in emergencies.

It is essential in a time such as this to strengthen and deepen our spiritual life, precisely so that we do not "lose sight of Jesus" (Hebrews 12:2). The Archdiocese will do everything possible to assist you with this; and there is an abundance of online resources – including Mass at home – to nourish your faith through this time. As Pope Francis has said, pastors will have to show creativity in ministering to their people; and there are many examples of this around the world, with technology making it less difficult than in the past.

To conclude I offer two prayers which you may wish to pray through this time. The first is one I have written: its words are simple but they may help to guide you in your prayer. May the God to whom we turn in this moment listen to the pleading of our heart and answer as he has so often before, so that love may come from fear, hope from despair and joy from sorrow:

Almighty and all-merciful God, lover of the human race, healer of all our wounds, in whom there is no shadow of death, save us in this time of crisis: grant wisdom and courage to our leaders; watch over all medical people as they tend the sick and work for a cure; stir in us a sense of solidarity beyond all isolation; if our doors are closed, let our hearts be open. By the power of your love destroy the virus of fear, that hope may never die and the light of Easter, the triumph of life, may shine upon us and the whole world. Through Jesus Christ, the Lord risen from the dead, who lives and reigns for ever and ever. Amen.

Holy Mary, health of the sick, pray for us. St Joseph, guardian of us all, pray for us.

We prayerfully seek your grace, amidst COVID-19 here and overseas.
We pray for those in need of healing.
We pray for your peace with those who are anxious or grieving.
We pray you will continue to strengthen and sustain all those who are serving in response.
We pray for your Holy Spirit's discernment amidst the many choices and decisions facing our national, community and medical leaders.
We pray we each might see quickly what more we can do to help those who are vulnerable.

This prayer for our nation in the family of nations, with all that is on our hearts, we gather now and pray through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Amen.

What this means for US at St James?

The provisions that are outlined here for our church and ministries at St James would make more sense if one has considered the Archbishop's message, so I hope we have taken time to read it. The provisions that follow adhere to the ones he gave and are applied to our context here in the parish.

- SUNDAY MASSES: Celebration of Sunday Masses (6pm Vigil, Sun 6am, 9am and 6pm) are suspended beginning this weekend and until further notice.
- Except for the priests, all the faithful are dispensed from the Sunday obligation. This particular dispensation means an exemption from physically coming to church on a Sunday, which is our obligation. Dispensation, in this case, does not imply that we no longer keep the Lord's Day Holy. We are still expected to pray as a household and are encourage to organise a special time on Sunday to reflect and medidate on the Scriptures, or you may watch mass online, 8am and 10am Sunday at www.archbne.org/bzw.
- I and Fr Dang will continue to celebrate
 Mass for the people (missa pro populo) on
 Sundays without a congregation. The
 eight (8) Augustinians residing at Villanova
 College, as a Community, will join together
 in offering this Mass pro populo at 8am on
 Sundays in our community chapel. We will
 be including in our intentions, among others, the end of the pandemic and for the
 safety of all.
- WEEKDAY MASSES: For the time being, weekday Masses in our Church will continue to be celebrated, with the current restrictions and precautions to be observed.
 8am Monday-Friday, except on Thursdays, when at 8am there is an exposition of the Blessed Sacrament.
- DAILY MASS BOOK: We are instructed not to share books at this time ("Hymn books" in the Archbishop's message). In line with this, weekly mass goers are no longer taking the Daily Mass Book 2020 (the small white guide book for daily mass) from its box. I would advise that you take one copy with you for you to bring for the daily mass. Those who do not come regularly to the weekday masses are not to take this book with them.
- SUNDAY VOLUNTEERS: We have communicated to our Sunday Mass volunteers thru email regarding the temporary halt of their duties until further notice (Sunday musicians, altar servers, lectors, communion ministers, collectors, hospitality, etc.).

- COMMUNION TO THE SICK. We have ceased the home visitations and bringing of communion to the sick and the homebound. Our volunteers who bring communion to them will continue their service by keeping in phone contact with them. Please keep the sick and homebound and their ministers always in your prayers.
- At this stage, only priests are allowed to take communion to the sick, and in general be restricted to Viaticum to the dying.
 Visitation of hospitals is designated to the hospital chaplain.
- SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION:
 This will be conducted in general only by appointment with the priest. Please consider calling or emailing the office.
- WEEKLY BULLETIN: This bulletin is the last one that the parish will be printing for the time being. However, we will continue to make our weekly bulletin, with the weekly reflections and updates. This shall be accessible thru our parish website, http://www.stjames-coorparoo.org.au/parish-bulletins.html

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS:

Unfortunately, due to the fact that most of our collection come from loose money and envelopes collected during our Sunday masses, which is no longer possible, and also due to the very limited number of parishioners who are enrolled in the direct debit method for making weekly contribution to the Augustinian Order (1st Collection) and for the upkeep of the Parish (2nd Collection), the financial implication is dire. I would like you to consider either:

- a.) Completing the attached page,"Direct Debit Request Offertory Giving"
- b.) Transferring directly into Account #: 006160102, BSB: 064 786 for 1st Collection Augustinian Order, Reference: your surname, and

Account #: 006161103, BSB: 064 786 for 2nd Collection Parish, Reference: your surname.

c.) Dropping the envelopes. For those who regularly donate using the planned giving envelopes, you may continue to use them and drop these off at your convenient time in the letterbox at the top of St James Priory steps.




