
On February 20th Sunday, during the 9am mass, we will farewell Fr Tuan Anh as he prepares for his next Augustinian appointment.

The daily reflections, written by the Executive Director, Dcn Peter Pellicaan, invite the reader to contemplate a verse from the Scripture reading of the day, and offers questions for reflection and discussion.

The daily reflections will only require 5-10 minutes for a person to read, reflect and pray. This Lenten practice will lead the reader into a deeper questioning and examination of their daily life. As they encounter both The Spirit and the Cross – in their families, workplaces and the community – they will walk as 'missionary disciples' on the path to Easter, and beyond.



Jesus Chooses His First Disciples


While Jesus is teaching, he notices two fishermen casting their nets and catching nothing. Jesus gets into one of the boats and tells the men to go into the deep water and lower their nets. Begrudgingly, the men row out, cast their nets and catch a great number of fish. Simon, James and John become Jesus' first disciples."When they had brought their boats to shore, they left everything and followed


him" (v. 11).

Imagine leaving everything behind to follow what you know is the right path. Jesus' apostles each made a commitment to be with him. Jesus became their number-one priority. The apostles all shared the same commitment and eventually formed a small community. It was a community strong enough to stay together, faithful to Jesus' message even after he died. Commitment makes a community strong. It does the same for a family.

Jesus was with his disciples almost daily for three years. They ate together, prayed together, worked together and, I'm sure, they had fun together. The more time they spent together, the closer they bonded.

Commitment to family involves the same activities. It takes eating, praying, playing and working with each other on a regular basis to build strong relationships. We have to earn a living and clean the house. We may have to

take care of an aging parent. But if our family is a priority, we will find the time to be together.

Sometimes that means sitting down each week and pulling out your appointment book or phone. If necessary, suspend your child's bedtime by a half hour. Give up sleeping in on a Saturday

morning or take the kids out of school for lunch if that's the only time you can find, but plan time each week to be together. It's that important!



FAMILY RESPONSE

Sit down together and set a date for the whole family to spend two hours together. Decide what you want to do, and commit to it.

PERSONAL RESPONSE

Do you find yourself choosing other commitments over your family? If so, how can you change this situation? Is it possible to commit some time each day to your relationship with God? Even five minutes in the morning, or before you fall asleep, would be great.
