
Parish Priest

Late last year, in the midst of the oftentimes frantic atmosphere that December and Christmas time usually brings to us, I was also finalising forms and documents for my Australian Permanent Visa (PR) application. At that time, if I flew overseas to visit family, I would not be able to just re-enter Australia (or at least I would not be a priority), unless I had a PR visa or Australian citizenship. So, I submitted my application before the year ended, pending a Visa Medical exam in early January 2022. When 2022 started, I got isolated (for COVID-19) and missed my original schedule for the Visa Medical exam. Migrants like myself would know of the difficulty of finding an ideal schedule for this as they are easily booked out. Eventually, I was able to reschedule the Visa Medical exam (not in Brisbane since they are booked out until March, but I was able to find a schedule at a Gold Coast immigration-recognised clinic, and that's where I had my exam). So 2021 ended and 2022 began with prayer and hope, in great anticipation for the results from the immigration office, which advised a 3-5 months waiting period.

On 24 January I received an unexpected surprise, very good news, that my Australian PR visa application was Granted. I prayed for this to come thru because I wanted to be in the Philippines for my Papa Arturo's (my father's) 1st year death anniversary come 28th March. It is quite complex to articulate how I felt not being able to visit my dad when he was showing signs of sickness in December 2020, and when he began to be seriously ill in the first quarter of 2021 due to a fast growing cancer, which lead to his passing in late March 2021. This wasn't an isolated case, as I know of some families and individuals who were in a similar situation last year: death of a family member overseas, and the difficulty of travel due to restrictions.

In early February, I immediately tried to find out whether I could get tickets to fly home pending the approval of our Provincial, Fr Peter Jones, OSA. And just last week, my planned home visit was finally approved and I was also able to secure plane tickets. With mixed emotions I can now say that I am flying to the Philippines on 5th March.

With the plans for the year led by the Parish Pastoral Council (PPC) in my mind, and the schedule that is in line with the Parish Strategic Direction or Planning (both by the PPC and Evangelisation Brisbane), I have chosen March and April to be away, so that I would be back before our **PARISH SUMMIT EVENT**, slated to take place on 30 April (more about this event soon!).



I would presume by now that you have heard of the news that Fr Tuan is unfortunately leaving the parish, as his appointment here at St James ends at the end of February. What this entails is that there will be an Augustinian who will cover for me from 1 March—22 April. His name is Fr John Sullivan, OSA. He is currently appointed as Prior and Formator at Brookvale in Sydney. Previous to this role, he was Parish Priest at St Thomas Parish in Mareeba and he spent 25 years as a missionary in Korea. Fr John's family lives here in Brisbane, and he's an 'Old Boy' at Villanova College (both he and his brother, Michael, who is also an Augustinian appointed currently in our Vietnam community). Hope you show Fr John your warm St James—Augustinian hospitality when he comes soon!

The Beatitudes

Jesus continues to share his message of hope and love. Crowds begin to gather as his reputation spreads throughout the countryside. In this reading we hear about those who are blessed and those who are not. In the language of the day, to be blessed was to be happy. The blessings are called the Beatitudes. "Blessed are you who are poor, for yours is the kingdom of God" (v. 20).



Every December I used to search for the perfect gift for each of my children—a gift that I was sure would light up their eyes on Christmas morning. Like every parent, I take great delight in seeing my children happy.

Imagine the satisfaction of being able to offer that joy with something that won't break when it's dropped or go out of fashion in a few months. That's the kind of happiness Jesus offers when he talks about the Beatitudes. Indeed, in his Sermon on the Plain, Jesus suggests we can be blessed with deep happiness in the most unpleasant of circumstances.

What's the secret of this joy, and how can we find it? We know it doesn't simply come with being poor or hungry, sad or persecuted. It might, however, be found in the way we look at and live through each of those situations.

Rich or poor, we all have to endure life's downs. No one can escape the pain of sickness or the death of a loved one. Perhaps the secret to happiness is in our accepting whatever life has to offer, certain that all will be well and confident of a happy ending.

All will be well because we don't have to rely solely on our own resources. God is with us, offering the strength we need. We also have the support of our family community in church and at home. And finally, we have
